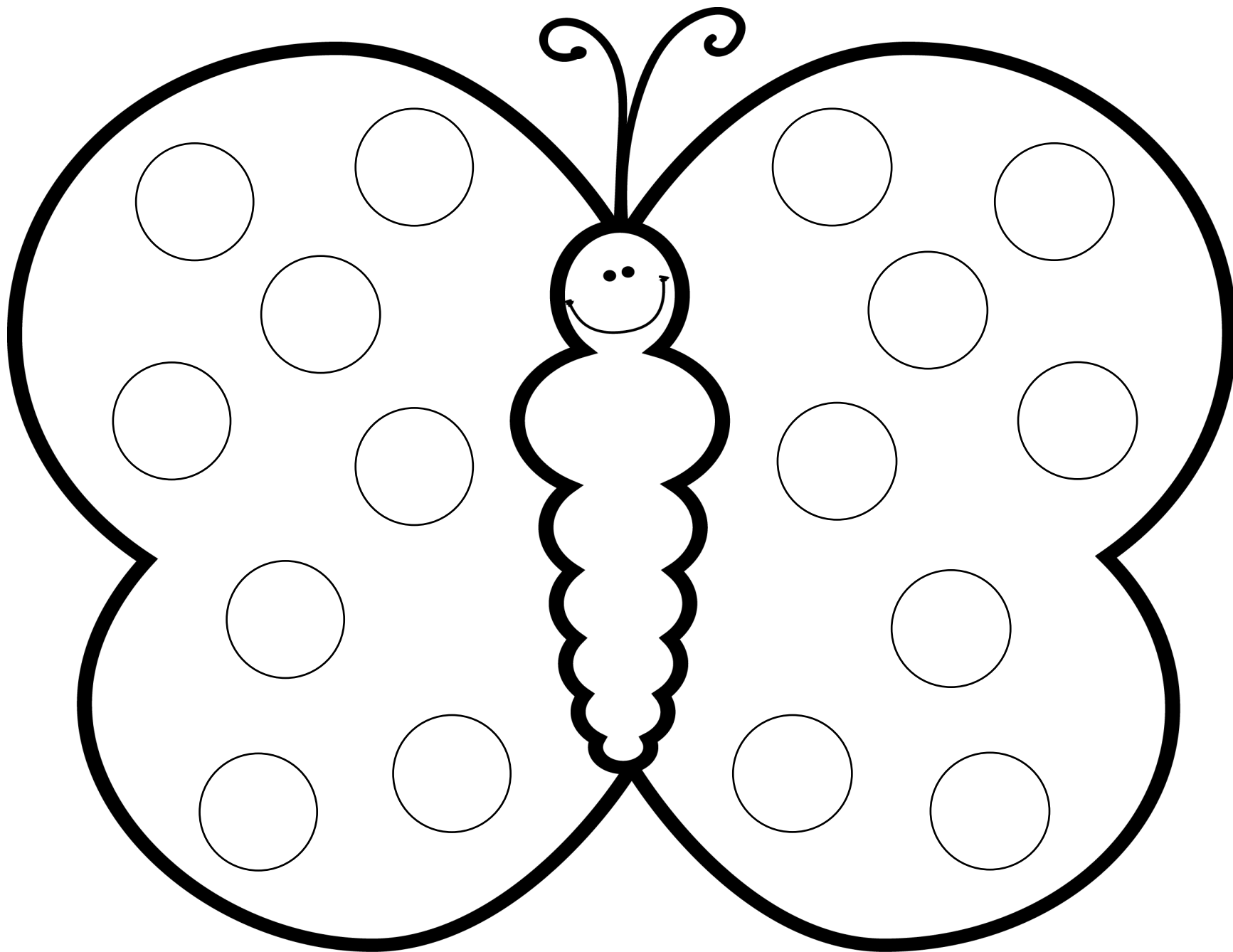
Or make your own version with the black and white butterfly.

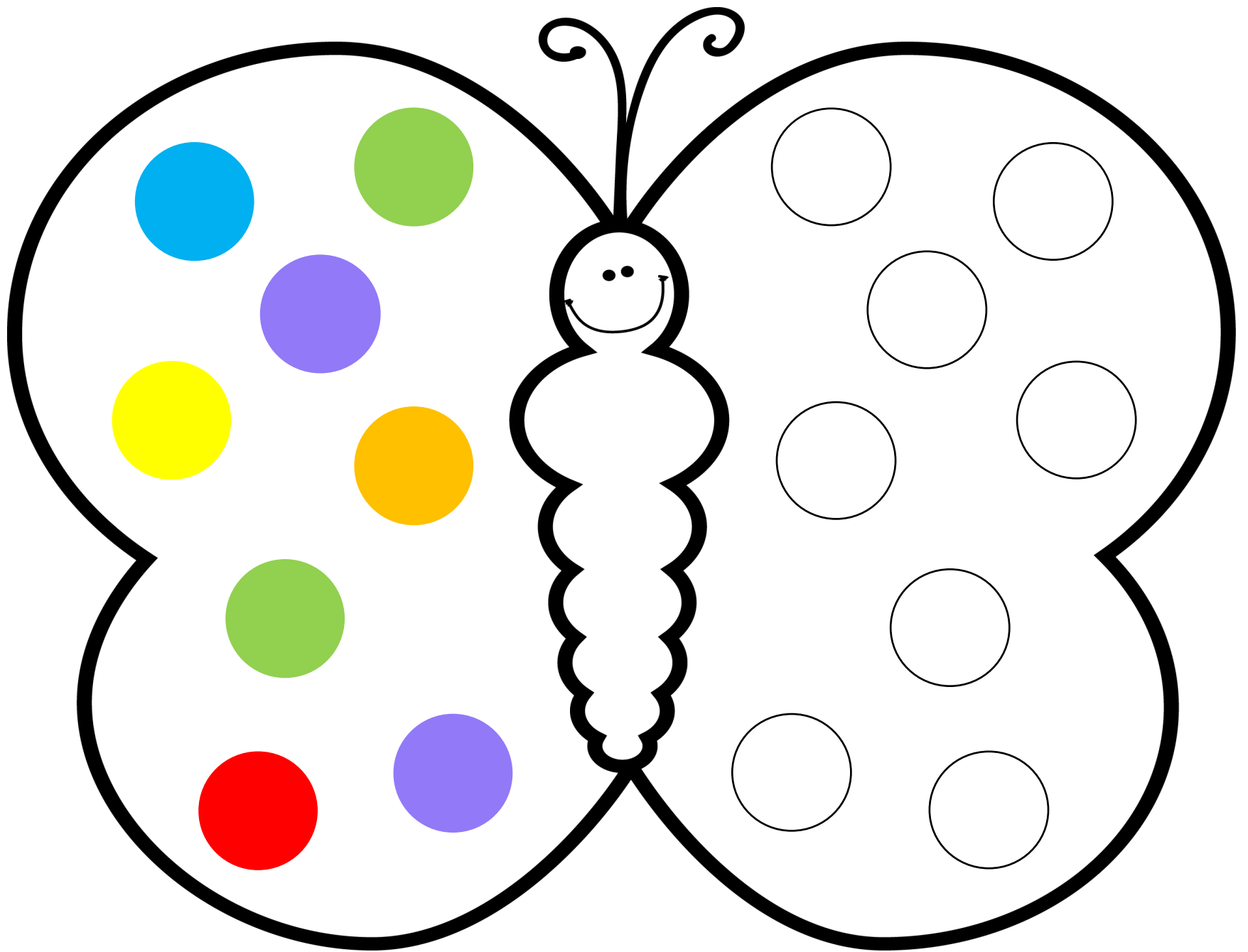
Put lowercase letters on one side and have kids put uppercase matches on the other. Or numbers. Or anything else you can think of.

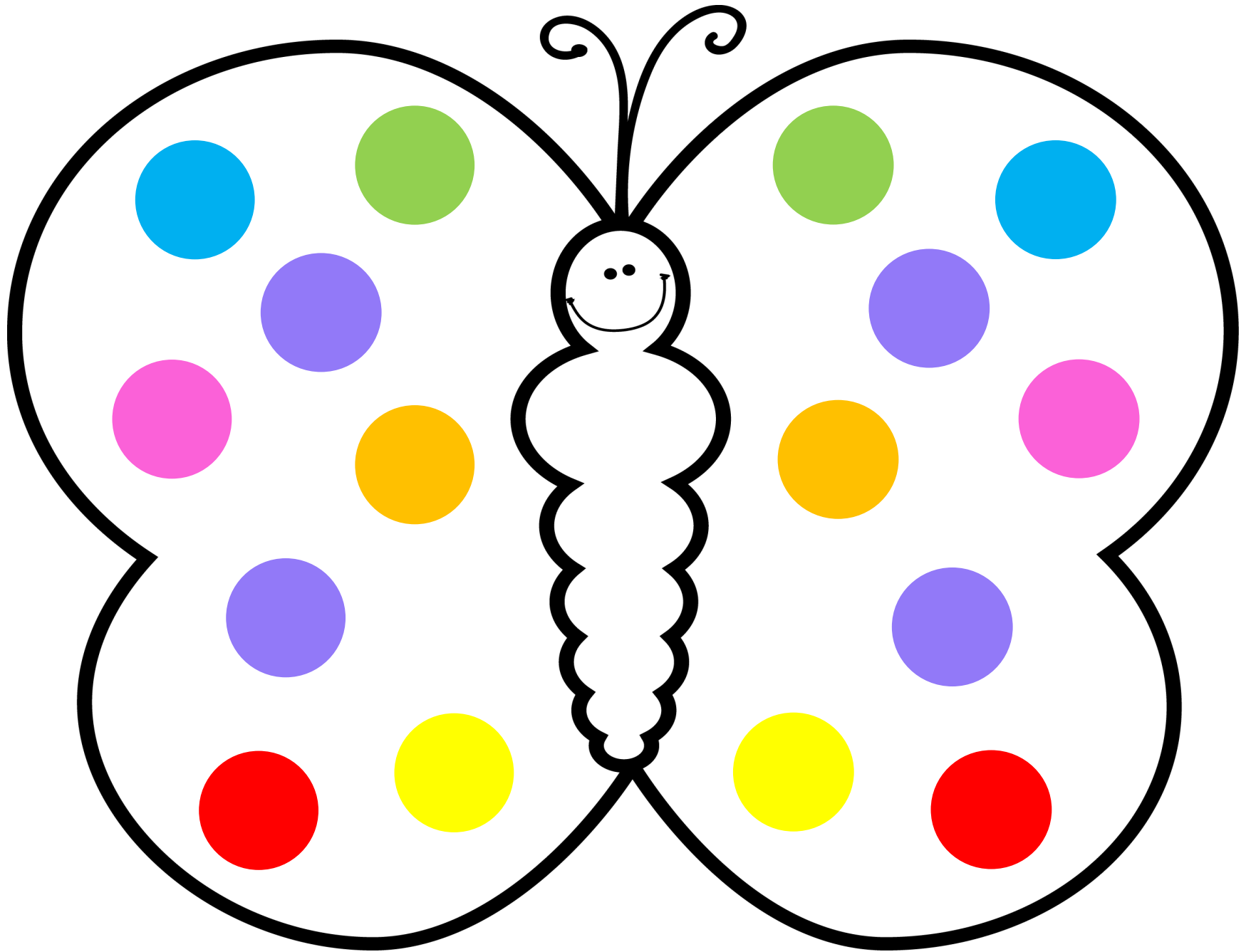

That page also includes blank jar so that you can choose to have your kids add a specific number of insects to the jar before winning.

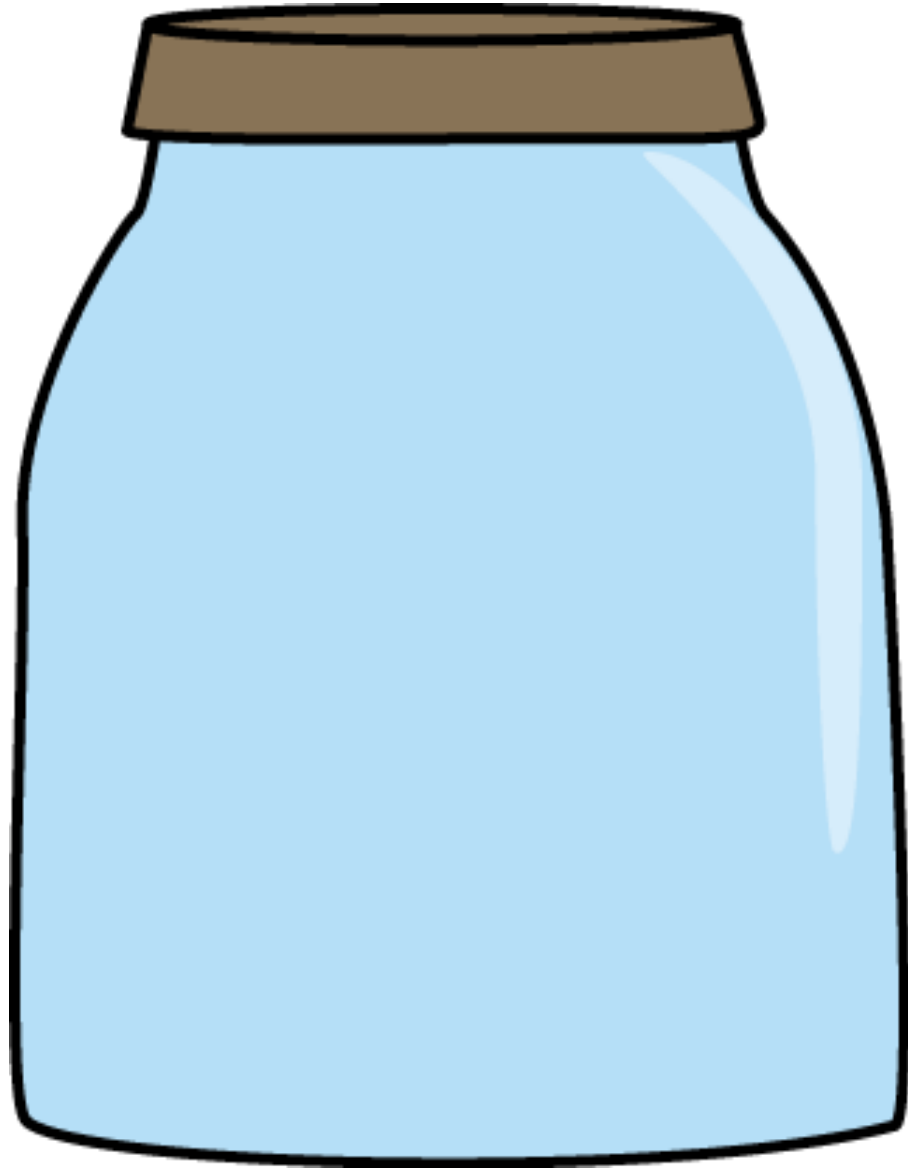
